A Chinese blanc-de-Chine porcelain libation cup, probably Kangxi period, of traditional horn form, moulded in relief with a dragon above three tigers, opposing a seated kylin and flying crane, height 7.3cm (chip to footrim), together with two Chinese blanc-de-Chine porcelain graduated figures of Guanyin, modelled kneeling, heights 15cm and 12.1cm, and a Chinese blanc-de-Chine and biscuit porcelain figure of Guanyin riding a large fish on a wave-moulded base, height 11.2cm.

Condition Report

1061. Libation cup - shallow 0.7cm x 0.5cm chip to rim on one side, tiny chip to rim on another side, but not particularly significant. 1.2cm x 0.4cm small chip to footrim edge just below the kylin and a similar smaller chip to other side of footrim just below the tigers. Typical light surface scratches to glaze, but no other significant issues or repairs.

Larger Guanyin - right hand has been off and re-glued, otherwise figure is in good condition with typical light surface scratches and minor wear to glaze.

Smaller Guanyin - generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Some scuffs and wear to glaze particularly to face and hands, but nothing too significant.

Guanyin & fish figure - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze.
