1005. Vase 1 - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical wear to gilt, more pronounced on rim. Typical light surface scratches and wear to gilt and enamels. Typical light crazing.

Vase 2 - 0.8cm x 0.5cm shallow chip to side of rim. Otherwise in generally good condition with no cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels and gilt, more pronounced on rim. Typical light crazing.

Both may have originally had covers.
