A George II gold pair cased keywind gentleman's pocket watch, the gilt fusee movement with finely pierced and engraved balance cock and diamond end stone, the backplate signed 'Peter Bacot London 519', the white enamelled dial with black Roman hour numerals, London 1752, case diameter 3.7cm, the outer case with finely engraved foliate design, total weight 85.5g, outer case diameter 4.4cm.

Condition Report

1097. The watch is cosmetically in generally good condition. Dial has a hairline crack running from the centre to 2 o'clock. Small chip to edge of dial at 9 o'clock and small chip and hairline at 6 o'clock. Fusee chain is broken so it does not run, but otherwise movement appears to be in good order. Gold case in good condition with only typical minor surface scratches and wear. Hinge is good and closes tightly. Glass in good condition. Inner case with good hallmarks and slightly indistinct 'AF' makers mark.

Outer case with matching 'AF' makers mark to interior.

Otherwise generally good condition, typical light surface scratches and wear but engraving still fairly crisp.

Hinge is good and closes tightly.
