A 19th century French silver coffee pot, the tapering cylindrical neck with anthemion bands and hinged lid with spiral finial, flanked by a horse's mask scroll spout and ebonized handle, above an ovoid body raised on three anthemion shouldered scroll legs terminating in paw feet, maker's mark for Jean-Pierre-Nicolas Bignon, Paris, weight 1209.9g, height 34.5cm.

## Condition Report

410. Generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Small dent to edge rim of cover. Hinge is good and cover closes down nicely. Finial slightly wobbly. Numerous small dents to the ovoid body. Spout, legs and feet in good order, and sits firmly with no wobble. Ebony/ebonized handle with repair to split on the curve and it is a little wobbly. Marks visible to neck and rim.
