A pair of late Victorian silver candlesticks, each with detachable beaded nozzle above a classical tapering cylindrical column decorated with bellflower garlands, ribbon festoons and tassels, on similarly decorated square beaded bases, London 1895 and 1896 by Thomas Bradbury & Sons, height 30.7cm.

Condition Report

374. Candlestick 1 - generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear, slightly more pronounced to highpoints but nothing obviously noticeable. Numerous small dents to edges of base. Good clear hallmark and matching part hallmark to nozzle.

Candlestick 2 - generally in similar condition to its pair with no significant damage or repairs. One corner of capital/sconce ever so slightly pushed down but hardly noticeable. Typical surface scratches and wear, slightly more pronounced to highpoints. Numerous small dents to edges of base. Good clear hallmark and matching part mark to sconce. Small section of plaster/filler broken off to corner of weighted base. Slightly more tarnished than the first candlestick, particularly around upper section.

Both would benefit from a clean.
