A small group of Chinese porcelain, including a wucai saucer dish, mark of Wanli but 19th century, painted with figures and dragon roundel, underglaze blue six-character mark to base, diameter 14cm (restoration), a yellow and brown dragon decorated yellow ground saucer, mark of Guangxu, diameter 13.2cm, and a blue and white beaker vase, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, painted with figures and pine tree, underglaze blue four-character mark to base, height 11.8cm (some faults).

Condition Report

1160. Yellow ground dragon dish - small area of restoration to rim which has been overpainted, otherwise typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze. Diameter as per catalogue description 13.2cm.

Hexagonal vase - generally good condition, minor glaze chips/fritting to rim, otherwise no cracks or repairs.

Blue and white vase - small chip to foot, otherwise in good condition.

Wucai dish - restoration and overpainting to broken our section of rim (approx 5.5cm x 3cm), and two restored and overpainted cracks to rim.

Bottle vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.
