A Chinese pale celadon jade and plate mounted hand mirror, mid to late Qing dynasty, the plated oval mirror back cast in relief with the eight Buddhist emblems and inset with hardstone cabochons, the central oval jade panel carved in relief with Buddha's hand citron and scrolling leafy stems, the jade belthook handle of typical serpentine form, carved and pierced with a chilong and dragon head terminal, length 23.5cm.

Condition Report

1120. Generally good condition and as it appears in the online images.

Jade panel appears to be in good condition, nice uniform colour and well carved. Unable to see the edges of the panel due to the mount but no obvious damage.

The jade belthook also appears to be in good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Nicely carved and good uniform colour. Part of the belthook handle is covered by the mount so unable to comment on this area.

The oval mirror mount in generally good condition with good crisp decoration with only minor wear to high points.

Inset stones are all present and well matched, a couple have visible internal inclusions.

The plated handle mount with wear to plate displaying the brass colour beneath.
