## LOT 1088

A Japanese cloisonné vase, Meiji period, of shouldered tapering form, decorated with ducks beneath blossoming branches on a graduated yellow to grey ground, unsigned, height 46cm (faults), together with a pair of Japanese cloisonné vases, Meiji period, decorated with sparrow and peony on a taupe ground, height 18cm (one with hairline cracks).

Estimate: £80 - £120

## Condition Report

1088. Large vase - large oval chip to back of vase (5cm x 4cm). Small chip and bruise to shoulder of vase (3 cm x 4cm). Another bruise to back of vase (4cm x 3cm). Both with minor enamel loss around/within area. Small dents to metal mounted rim.

Image side of the vase in generally good order with typical light surface scratches and wear.

Pair of vases - Vase 1 - generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Footrim slightly loose but ok.

Vase 2 - hairline cracks to enamel, otherwise ok.
