A Chinese chestnut brown-ground silk embroidered 'dragon' robe, late Qing dynasty, finely worked in coloured and gold threads with nine five-clawed dragons, vapours, Buddhist emblems, bats and precious objects, above flowers and crashing waves, the collar and cuffs with further polychrome dragons and vapours on a black ground, fitted with gilt metal fastenings, length 141.5cm.

Estimate: £800 - £1,200

Condition Report

1200. The robe is in generally good condition with bright vibrant colours and no significant damage. Some minor unstitching to the gilt thread and on the body of the robe. the most significant area of damage is the collar panel with more pronounced unstitching and wear to the black ground. Stitched repair to small tear on back edge of robe, minor unstitching to the joints of the brown silk and some minor stitch holes visible where blue silk lining is attached. Blue lining with some typical staining and wear. Top fastening loop worn and broken and one fastening loop replaced with a black silk loop.

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
