LOT 4822

A mid-19th century Beaumont-Adams 54-bore five-shot double-action revolver with octagonal sighted barrel, barrel length 11cm, engraved 'Thomas Horsley, Gun Maker, York', the frame engraved 'Adams Patent No 28499R' and 'B 12836', with safety stop, Adams Patent rammer arm (probably replaced) and chequered wood grip, with an associated case, probably once a cutlery canteen box.

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

4822. Packing arm looks replaced, not the correct colour, looks too new. Some heavy impact marks to underside of barrel, looks as if it has been used to knock a pin or something hard. Gun looks overall quite worn. Action works, half and full cocks. Trigger guard looks misshapen, some heavy bruising, screw fitting misaligned and poorly re-fitted. Some light rust evidence to cylinder, overall loss of blue finish. Good proportion of blueing remaining to gun overall. Box later replaced and re-fitted. Case measurements 35cm wide, 25.5cm deep, 6cm high.
