A Sèvres porcelain pink ground cabinet cup and saucer, date code for 1767, painter's mark for Theodore, both the can shaped cup and saucer painted with exotic birds within gilt foliate framing beneath a gilt dentil rim, blue painted interlaced 'L's' mark to bases with incised numerals to can, diameter of saucer 13.5cm, together with a similarly painted Sèvres porcelain pink ground teapot, 19th century, with matched later silver gilt cover hallmarked for 1897, height 9.5cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

The can and saucer are in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration - both have typical blemishes to the paste since manufacture.

The can has a firing crack to the lower handle terminal and misfiring to the pink ground.

The saucer has noticeable wear to the cavetto.

Otherwise both pieces have typical wear/rubbing to the gilding, particularly to the rims and handles.

The teapot has a matched later silver gilt cover.

The teapot otherwise has no restoration or cracks, but there are some small nibbled chips to the tip of the spout. There is some misfiring to the pink ground and typical light wear/rubbing to the gilding. There are some scratches to the painted panels of the teapot.
