A pearlware blue printed two-handled sauce tureen and cover with integral stand, early 19th century, with a figural chinoiserie landscape view of opium smokers, height 16.5cm, a similar lobed dish, printed with a basket of flowers, length 26.5cm, a Staffordshire figure group titled 'Death of Nelson', height 20cm, a pair of Staffordshire figures modelled as a man and woman holding fruit, height 18cm, a Staffordshire spill vase group modelled with two deer, and a small group of other pottery, including a Dutch Delft plate, diameter 23.3cm, and a graduated pair of Wedgwood floral decorated jugs (minor faults).

### Condition Report

Death of Nelson - Both attendant figures have professional restoration to the necks, the left fingers and thumb of Nelson have restoration and subsequently also the fingers of the kneeling figures left hand. The black of Nelson's hat has been re-painted, as has the kneeling figures black shoe. Typical overall crazing to the glaze with a stronger craze line running vertically through the base by the 'h' of 'Death'. The gilt title has worn a little.
