### LOT 1597

A pair of Meissen style white glazed porcelain centrepieces, late 19th/early 20th century, both modelled with two putti with floral garlands on naturalistic floral encrusted bases before foliate columns supporting pierced oval baskets, cancelled underglaze blue crossed swords marks to bases, height 28cm (restored), together with a pair of Royal Worcester ivory glazed and bisque celadon porcelain posy vases modelled as a putto with a goat or a dog, impressed marks to bases, height 12.5cm (restored), a Minton turquoise glazed aesthetic plate with pierced rim, enamelled with a central bird and a border of butterflies and blossom, diameter 24cm (restored), and a Continental porcelain gilt overlaid green ground floral painted part service, including twelve coffee cups and saucers and three teacups and saucers.

### Condition Report

Pair of centrepieces - first with putto placing garland on head of other putto has one restored handle to basket and some restoration to the basket itself, two restored putti wings, restored garland, restored left foot of putti which sits on left edge of base with associated restoration to applied flowers here. The second with the embracing putti has both handles of the basket restored with some restoration to the basket primarily through the base, and some of the applied flowers and foliage to the base are also restored resulting in some associated work to the base edges. This restoration is all professionally executed and is not immediately apparent due to the white glaze, only noticeable on closer inspection.

Minton plate - heavily crazed and with restoration to the rim.

Worcester with goat - goat's left horn and ear restored.

Worcester with dog - ok

Green ground floral painted cups and saucers - each in good condition with no damage or repairs.
