A T.J. & J. Mayer Prattware Crimea War subject tankard, 19th century, printed to one side with a group of four portraits titled 'Balaklava, Inkerman, Alma', opposing a scene of war titled 'The Redoubt, Inkerman', within puce line borders, the rim interior with a band of fruiting vine, height 15cm, together with a pair of Prattware pot lids titled 'War' and 'Peace', framed, a similar pink ground loving cup printed with birds and a pink lustre decorated Staffordshire pottery jug (minor faults).

Condition Report

Crimea tankard - overall fine crazing to the glaze with some minor stain spots, e.g. to the interior sides and base underside and interior. Amidst the crazing some slightly more noticeable craze lines almost appear as haircracks, e.g. to the lower handle terminal and vertically from the rim, longest approx 2cm. Otherwise in good condition with no cracks or restoration. Enamels good and bright still.

Bird loving cup - crazed overall and heavily stained, minor scratches to decoration.

Lustre jug - crazed with short vertical haircrack to rim by handle, otherwise ok.

Two framed lids - both crazed but no other visible damage due to nature of framing. The frame itself is in poor condition.
