"A large mixed group of mostly Stourbridge air trap satin glassware, late 19th century, including vases, jugs and posy holders, predominantly with a quilted diamond design but also chevrons, trails and spots, in blue, pink, yellow, cranberry, orange and caramel colours, height of tallest pair 23cm (some faults).

Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass."

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

The lot is generally in good condition, there are some issues as follows;

Pair of olive green jugs - both with cracks to handle.

Pair of dark blue vases - one with minor bruise to side, fairly inconsequential.

Tall large pale blue jug - missing one tiny 'thorn' from handle.

Lobed pale blue jug - indistinct tiny impact bruise to side.

Two handled pale blue vase - 2 'thorns' on one of the handles are chipped.

Pale blue vase with trailed 'scarf' wrapped to neck - missing ends of wrapped 'scarf'.

Pale blue bottle vase - inconsequential impact bruise to widest part of body.

Footed pink posy - four of the five feet are chipped.

Shaded orange vase - minor impact bruise to side.

Pink chevron jug - faults to handle.

Dark pink diamond pattern vase - minor bruise to side.
