A pair of Bow porcelain putto figures, circa 1770, both standing wearing a floral garland and headdress holding a basket of flowers before bocage, on pierced scroll moulded bases, red painted anchor and dagger mark to bases, height 16cm, together with a mixed group of early 19th century Coalbrookdale wares, including a pair of John Rose Coalport Feltspar porcelain two-handled vases and covers painted with birds and flowers, a pair of Derby green glazed floral filled planters, height 6.5cm, a pair of Bloor Derby green glazed watering cans and covers, a Bloor Derby potpourri basket and cover and a small basket filled with fruit, length 4.5cm (faults and restoration throughout).

Condition Report

Bow figures - first with glued repairs to right shoulder and wrist with minor restoration here, otherwise typical losses and small areas of restoration to applied flowers and foliage, generally not too bad overall. Second with more extensive damage, the putto has been broken through the top of the base and restored back into position, with similar breaks and restoration to the upper right arm, right hand, left shoulder and the right section of bocage, the left section of bocage is completely missing and there are losses and repairs to the remaining applied flowers and foliage - particularly in the basket.

Pair of two-handled vases - first with large chip to edge of foot and glued handle and very short hairline to rim, otherwise not too bad. The other vase is in quite a poor state with glued repairs to the foot, both handles and extensive restoration to the neck. Both covers are extensively broken and visibly glued/restored. Derby green glazed filled planters - both with extensive losses to the flowers and foliage, the planters themselves are generally ok but with crazing and a haircrack to one.

Watering cans - first has detached handle which is present with the lot, other has restored handle and restoration to the flowers on one side and the spout. Otherwise both have significant losses to the applied flowers and foliage.

Bloor Derby potpourri and cover - fundamentally not in too bad a condition, but with losses to the applied flowers on the sides primarily, minor crazing.

Fruit basket - some small typical losses, generally ok'ish.

Flower filled basket - lacking handle, typical losses to applied flowers and foliage.

Two small potted plants - Plaue porcelain, small losses.

Pair heart-shaped - original stoppers replaced with glued flowers, small typical losses.
