A mixed group of English and Continental pottery and porcelain, late 19th and 20th century, including a Cantagalli lustre decorated cup and saucer, Royal Copenhagen model of a cockerel, height 14cm, three pieces of Burleigh Ware nursery china decorated with a toy horse and inscribed 'Gee-Gee', a Crown Ducal Orange Tree pattern toast rack with matching sauceboat, sugar bowl and three soup plates, a Royal Worcester pepper in the form of a cottage loaf and a Poole plate painted with a nautical signal flag, diameter 21.8cm (minor faults).

Condition Report

Cantagalli cup has some fritted chipping to the top rim edge, otherwise ok.

Orange Tree toast rack is crazed but generally ok.

Orange Tree sauceboat displays wear to black decoration.

Goebel cockerel has a glued repair to his head and chipping to his comb.

Koala dish has horizontal haircrack to the front edge.

One of the three Orange Tree soup plates has worn decoration.

Macintyre shell shaped dish is heavily crazed and stained with light wear to the gilt rim.

Small floral painted Worcester dish has a minuscule nick to the underside rim edge.

Gee Gee trio - saucer and plate are crazed but ok, cup ok and not crazed.

Otherwise the items in the lot are in good condition.
