"A Worcester porcelain Argument pattern blue printed coffee pot and matched cover, 1775-85, of pear shape with gilt highlights, disguised numeral mark to base, height 23cm, together with a small group of other 18th century Worcester porcelain, comprising a blue painted Mansfield pattern circular bowl, diameter 15.4cm, an Argument pattern bowl, diameter 12cm, a Three Flowers pattern saucer, diameter 11cm, a globular teapot and cover polychrome enamelled with Chinese figures, height 13cm, and a similar teapot and cover polychrome painted with flowers, height 14cm (faults and repairs).

Note: both teapots with 'Michael Johnson Collection' labels."

Condition Report

Coffee pot - cover is matched and has professional restoration to the finial and part of the rim edge, there is a restored crack to the main body which includes the lower handle terminal and some repainting along its length, it trails into the underside.

Mansfield bowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, light surface scratches/wear to base interior.

Argument bowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, light surface scratches/wear to base interior.

Three Flowers saucer - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Chinese Figures teapot - a section of the body including the spout has been broken away and restored back with visible old rivet holes. Tiny chip to tip of spout and top rim edge of cover.

Floral teapot - the pot is broken into a number of pieces and visibly repaired with rivets, all the pieces seem to be present. The cover is cracked with a large chip to the edge, the finial is glued back into position with minor losses along the break lines.
