### LOT 1548

A pair of Fell pearlware pottery baskets, early 19th century, of oval shape with overlapping lattice sides, the base interiors with a chinoiserie print, 25cm long, together with a pair of matched stands of loose diamond shape with basketweave moulding and looped pierced rims, impressed marks, length 28cm, and a similar pearlware footed bowl of circular shape.

### Condition Report

Both baskets have a vertical crack to one end, more noticeable on one although both fairly inconspicuous due to the nature of the lattice work. Otherwise both are in good condition with fine typical crazing to the glaze.

One stand has a short haircrack to the lattice work at one end which encroaches into the main body. Otherwise both are in good condition overall with typical fine crazing to the glaze.

The bowl is in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, it rings nicely as there is no crazing. There is some incredibly minimal glaze fritting to the rim.
