A late 20th century French lacquered brass gorge cased calendar carriage alarm clock by L'Epée, the eight day movement striking and repeating on a gong, the backplate with stamped L'Epée maker's mark, the signed white enamelled dial with black Roman hour numerals, outer Arabic minutes and moonphase aperture above subsidiary day, alarm and date dials, the case with swing handle and bevelled glass panels, height 18cm, with winding key, hang tag, paperwork, case and outer card box.

Condition Report

1210. The clock is in generally good condition. The case would benefit from a light clean as it is a little dusty and dirty. All glass panels appear to be in good condition. Dial in good clean condition. Both trains of movement wind smoothly and it is currently running, strike mechanism also working, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. All sub dials adjust smoothly. Push button repeat not currently engaging so would require attention.

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
