A late 19th century French lacquered brass gorge cased carriage clock by Drocourt, with eight day movement striking hours and half hours and repeating on a gong, the signed backplate stamped '35793', the enamelled dial with black Roman hour numerals and outer Arabic minutes, detailed 'Examined by Dent 34 Cockspur St London', the gorge case with swing handle and bevelled glass panels, the underside with two position lever for 'Striking' and 'Silent', height 17.5cm, with leather travelling case and key.

Condition Report

1215. The clock is in generally good condition. Case with typical light surface scratches and wear, but no significant damage or repairs. Glass back door has small chip to lower left corner, otherwise glass panels appear to be in good order. Dial in good clean condition, some minor wear/fading to 'Examined by Dent...' wording. Both trains wind smoothly, strike mechanism and repeat both working as they should and it is currently running, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

Travelling case in generally good order with typical scuffs, tears and wear.
