A late 19th century French brass and Sèvres style porcelain carriage clock by Margaine, the eight day movement striking hours and half hours on a gong, the backplate with stamped maker's mark, the porcelain dial with black Roman hour numerals and detailed 'Howell, James & Co to the Queen London', and painted with cherubs and flowers within gilt and bleu céleste borders, the porcelain side panels similarly painted, the foliate scroll engraved cornice case with swing handle, height 16cm.

Condition Report

1216. Generally good condition, typical light surface scratches and wear to case, a little dusty and dirty so would certainly benefit from a clean. Engraving still pretty crisp. Glass panels appear to be in good order. Porcelain dial has small crack to top left corner, otherwise porcelain panels are in good order. Movement winds smoothly and is currently running, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. Strike mechanism also in good working order.

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
