A George II silver tankard of girdled tapering cylindrical form, the domed hinged lid and pierced scroll thumbpiece above a scroll handle, the front monogram engraved, on a skirted base, London 1752/53 by Fuller White, weight 838g, height 19cm. Note: the London silversmith Fuller White produced this tankard in the same year he made the Norfolk mace for Robert Dinwiddie (1693-1770), then Lieutenant Governor of the Royal Colony of Virginia, who presented it to the city of Norfolk in 1753.

Condition Report

385. Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Small fairly insignificant dent to one side of body and a larger dent to the dome of the hinge lid. Small dent to footrim. Interior showing signs of lower section of handle pushed in ever so slightly. Hinge is good and lid sits down nice and flat. Good clear hallmarks to top of cover, to side of body and part mark to handle.
