LOT 1004

A Chinese famille rose landscape porcelain bowl, mark of Jiaqing but probably later Qing dynasty, of flared circular form, the exterior painted with pavilions in a landscape opposing an extensive black text and two red seals, underglaze blue four-character mark to base, height 5.5cm, diameter 10.8cm (chip and hairline to rim), together with a Chinese Imari export porcelain teapot and cover, 18th century, painted with flowers, height 12.5cm, and a Canton famille rose oval dessert dish, length 26.9cm (chipped and cracked).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1004. Bowl - small chip to rim and 1.1cm vertical hairline to rim, otherwise no significant damage or repairs. Decoration is good and vibrant.

Imari teapot - chip to tip of spout and typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels. Otherwise good condition with no cracks or repairs.

Canton dish - numerous chips to rim and 2cm and 2.5cm hairline cracks to rim. Surface scratches and wear to enamels and gilt.
