### LOT 1023

A small group of Chinese famille rose export porcelain, Qianlong period and later, comprising a small oval dish, painted with flower sprays, length 12.5cm, a matching trencher salt, length 8.4cm (chipped and cracked), a taperstick holder, the shallow dish with barbed rim applied with five fruits and centred with a cylindrical holder, diameter 13.5cm (minor rim restoration), and a Canton rectangular dish, painted with birds, butterflies and flowers, length 22cm.

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

1023. Oval dish - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels and glaze.

Salt - chip to rim, and chip and 3.7cm hairline to footrim. Star crack to centre of the well. Typical surface scratches and wear to enamels and glaze.

Jostick holder dish - chip and restoration to rim (the restoration covering approx 0.5cm x 3cm). Chips to leaves/stalks of fruit. Central aperture/tube is good and rest of dish ok. Typical surface scratches and wear to enamels and glaze.

Canton dish - minor chip to one corner, otherwise dish in good condition with no cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to gilt and enamels. Decoration is bright and vibrant.
