A Chinese blue silk embroidered dragon robe, late Qing dynasty, finely worked in coloured and gold threads with nine five-clawed dragons, vapours, flaming pearls, Buddhistic emblems, bats and precious objects, above crashing waves and rocks with diagonally striped hem border, the collar and horseshoe cuffs similarly decorated with dragons, bats, vapours and waves on a black ground, fitted with gilt metal fastenings, length 131.5cm.

Estimate: £200 - £400

Condition Report

1060. The robe is in generally good condition with good vibrant colours and no significant damage or repairs. Border around neck is a little worn, some minor unstitching around neck panels and other minor unstitching elsewhere, but nothing too significant. Few minor holes to blue silk ground, but again not obviously noticeable. Two gilt metal fasteners have been replaced with later small buttons. Three of the silk fastening loops have been replaced and one has torn so will need attention. Some discolouration/staining to silk lining. Embroidery is good, bright and vibrant.

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
