A Chinese Ming style blue and white porcelain moonflask, mark of Qianlong but later, each side painted with eight lappet petals enclosing the eight Buddhist emblems (bajixiang), radiating from a central boss decorated with a flowerhead, all within keyfret borders, the narrow sides with bands of stylized lotus and scrolling tendrils, on a similarly decorated foot, underglaze blue seal mark to base, height 40cm (lacking neck and handles).

Estimate: £200 - £400

Condition Report

1135. As can be seen (and noted in the catalogue description), the moonflask is missing its neck and handles. Otherwise, body and foot in good condition with no other cracks, chips or restoration. Typical light surface scratches to glaze.
