### LOT 1563

A Coalport 'jewelled' cabinet cup and saucer, circa 1900, of quatrelobe shape, the gilt exterior of the cup and saucer upper surface applied with enamelled turquoise 'jewels' of graduated size, the cup interior and well of the saucer pink glazed, green printed marks to bases, cup marked in gilt 'T.239', diameter of saucer 10cm, height of cup 4cm (cup crazed and with haircrack, saucer crazed with small haircrack and chip), together with a small Coalport gilt-lined basket with overhead handle, the exterior lilac glazed with gilt stylized foliate detail, green printed factory mark to base with numerals '7142', height to top of handle 7cm.

Estimate: £60 - £100

### Condition Report

Copied cup - there is a very faint vertical haircrack to one of the lobed sections and crazing visible to the pink glazed interior, subsequently the cup does not 'ring' when tapped. 2 of the smaller 'jewels' towards the base of the cup have small chips and two of the other 'jewels' have surface pinprick sized holes/blemishes.

Saucer - heavily crazed with an approx 0.5cm square chip to the underside edge of one lobed corner with an associated short haircrack running from this chip. At least two of the 'jewels' have chips and a lot of others around the well have surface wear/blemishes.

Basket - overall crazing to the glaze with some minor staining visible to the lilac ground, small spot of wear to gilding of handle.
