LOT 1818

A Continental milky white opaque glass vase, late 19th/early 20th century, enamelled and gilt overall with birds and insects amidst scrolling foliage, the overturned rim of scalloped shape, height 21cm (chip to rim), together with a pair of amber tinted crackle glass vases enamelled with birds and flowers, height 19cm, and a group of similar Continental mostly enamelled and/or gilt glass, including a decanter and stopper, a jug and pair of goblets and an opaline two-handled vase (faults and repairs). Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Condition Report

Milky white opaque vase with overturned scalloped rim decorated with birds and insects - 2 sizeable chips to one scalloped section of rim on upper edge (due to the shape of the rim they are not immediately noticeable), and a few much smaller and insignificant nicks to other sections of rim edge. Decoration good with no real wear.

Opaque white pot, cover and stand - generally good but with a few very, very minor nicks to the rim edges, very insignificant.

Gilt decorated opaline decanter and stopper - in good condition but with some wear to the gilding.

Pair of footed opaque white bottle vases gilt and pale blue blossom decoration - both with small chip to outer rim edge of neck, some wear.

Opaline vase enamelled with band of flowers - gilt decoration totally worn away, otherwise ok.

Bulbous opaline vase with gilt and enamelled foliate decoration - lacking original handles, small faults to shoulders where they would have been.

Blue enamelled cylinder vase - large section of lower body broken away and visibly glued back into position.

Relief gilt-hooped cylinder vase - a few miniscule nicks to top rim edge.

Pair amber tinted vases - one with chip to neck rim, otherwise both ok. Not an opposing pair.

Otherwise items in the lot are in good condition overall with some typical wear in places commensurate with age and handling.
