LOT 1847

A gilded clear glass bowl, probably French, early 20th century, of bulbous shape gilt with Rococo 'C' scrolls and roses, height 18cm, together with a gilt glass vase and bowl decorated with prunus, probably Thomas Webb, height of vase 18.5cm, and five other pieces of glass, including a single-handled square shaped dish gilt and enamelled with a branch of pears, a footed tazza gilt and enamelled with ears of wheat, and a gilt decorated and engraved footed bowl (some faults).

Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

The tazza decorated with wheat has a sizeable chip to its foot and re-gilding to the top rim edge. The two Thomas Webb pieces display quite a bit of wear to the gilding, otherwise each item in the lot is in good condition overall with no damage or repairs but some typical wear commensurate with age and handling.
