### LOT 1404

A set of eight Derby porcelain topographical named view plates, late 18th century, each painted with a central rectangular panel framed in gilt within a gilt edged apple green ground, pattern No. 314, the views comprising Overton Plymouth, Eltham Kent, Keswick Bridge, Near Chelsea Bridge Middlesex, Ambleside, Westmoreland, Near Caenarvon [sic] and A Mill Near Horsham, blue painted factory marks, diameter 23cm (some faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

Overton - in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration, very minor typical wear to gilding.

Eltham - wear to gilt rim between 7 and 12 o'clock, otherwise good.

Horsham - badly cracked.

Caenarvon - in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration, very minor typical wear to gilding.

Westmoreland - approx one fifth section of rim broken away in 2 large pieces and museum style restored, around the 6 o'clock area.

Keswick - badly cracked.

Ambleside - chip to underside rim edge at 7 o'clock, not visible from upper surface, otherwise ok.

Chelsea Bridge - chip to underside rim edge at 8 o'clock which is minimally visible from upper surface - otherwise ok.
