### LOT 1576

A Worcester Pine Cone Group pierced drainer dish, circa 1775, of circular shape with scalloped rim, hatched crescent mark in underglaze blue to base, diameter 23cm (chip to rim), together with a small group of other Worcester porcelain, comprising a Three Flowers circular butter dish and cover, Three Flowers mustard pot and cover, height 9.5cm, Three Flowers sucrier and cover, Plantation Print small mug, height 8.8cm, and a Bat pattern sparrow beak jug, height 12cm (faults and restoration).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

Drainer dish - approx 1cm long by 0.5cm wide chip to upper rim edge, otherwise ok.

Bat jug - badly broken with riveted repairs.

Mustard - body cracked, cover chipped.

Sucrier - body with 2 sizeable areas of restoration.

Mug - crack across upper handle terminal.

Butter - one handle of tub poorly restored, some staining, cover with chipping to petals of finial which also has some staining.
