A Wedgwood brown printed part service, 19th century, decorated with a number of chinoiserie views, comprising twelve graduated platters in six sizes, largest 47.5cm long, smallest 24cm long, three oval tureen bases and two covers, eleven soup plates, sixteen dinner plates 24.5cm diameter, eight dessert plates 20.5cm diameter, thirteen tea plates 18.3cm diameter, soup tureen base, two square bowls, two square dishes, two sauce boats, a sauce tureen with integral base, cover and ladle, coffee pot and cover, ten coffee cups and ten saucers, various impressed and printed marks to bases (faults).

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Overall the service is in good condition with no significant damage.

One of the second largest platters 42cm long has a chip to the underside rim edge at one end which is not visible from the upper surface.

One of the square serving bowls is heavily crazed and stained with some chipping to the footrim.

Cover of the sauce tureen has a glued repair to the finial.

Coffee cups - six are in good condition, 2 are cracked, 2 have chipping.

Coffee pot has a small chip to the spout.

Coffee saucers - one has a starcrack, most have some light staining to the footrim.

One tea plate is badly chipped.

One dessert plate is cracked.

2 soup plates have chips.
