LOT 1235

A pair of Chinese Canton famille rose porcelain vases, mid to late 19th century, each shouldered tapering body painted with opposing figural panels, reserved against a ground of birds amidst peonies and fruit, the similarly decorated flared neck applied with chilong to shoulders and Buddhistic lion and cub handles, height 44.5cm (one with chip and hairline to rim).

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

1235. Vase 1 - generally good condition, small chip/glaze blemish to underside of rim. Small hairline to body, visible from interior. Faint hairline visible to exterior (approx 3cm long). Otherwise body in good condition with bright and vibrant decoration. Typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze, enamels and gilt. Vase 2 - 6cm vertical hairline and 'V' shaped chip to rim (approx 2.5cm x 1.5cm), otherwise in good condition with no other significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels and gilt. Decoration is bright and vibrant. Both a bit dusty and dirty, so would certainly benefit from a clean.
