A pair of Chinese wucai porcelain vases, Transitional style but late 19th/early 20th century, each of baluster form, painted with opposing panels of a mythical horse above waves, height 19cm, together with a pair of Chinese Canton famille rose porcelain vases, mid-19th century, of square tapering form, typically painted with figures, flowers and butterflies, height 14cm (faults), and a famille verte powder blue ground porcelain baluster vase and cover, height 22.2cm (faults).

Condition Report

1171. Pair of wucai vases - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Only typical light surface scratches to glaze.

Pair of Canton vases:

Vase 1 - chips to two corners of rim and a small hairline to rim, typical surface scratches and wear to enamels and gilt, decoration is vibrant, body otherwise in good condition.

Vase 2 - two chips to rm and broken in half and re-glued. Chips down on edge of the vase. Typical surface scratches and wear to enamels and gilt. Decoration otherwise vibrant.

Famille verte and blue vase - chip and 3cm vertical hairline to rim, otherwise good condition, cover with chip to rim, both with typical light surface scratches to glaze.
